



Student Ministry Dress Code

Your dress should be representative of who we are as Christians, students, and adults. Set an example for the people we are serving.

The Code:

- Sleeves, please. No tank tops, spaghetti strap tops, halter tops, tube tops, etc.
- Undergarments and their straps should not be visible.
- Hemlines and necklines should be modest; no low-cut tops.
- No tight-fitting clothes or sagging pants (hanging low below the waist).
- No short-shorts, or short hemlines. (Hem should be even with, or longer than, extended fingertips with arms at side).
- No t-shirts or logos representing unGodly philosophies - including offensive music groups. (Staff discretion).
- No bare midriffs – shirts should be long enough that no skin is visible.
- Please be modest, cover up!
 - **Girls:** If you ONLY have a bikini, it should be covered with a dark t-shirt. If you have a one-piece swimsuit that is low cut and revealing, a dark t-shirt should also be worn. Tankinis are ok, but please observe the no bare midriff rule above.
 - **Guys:** No speedo bottoms or bike shorts. The same rules apply as shorts.
- Please Keep It Hidden.
 - See-through attire is unacceptable unless an article of clothing is worn underneath the garment that complies with the dress code.
 - No torn, slit, or ripped clothing in an inappropriate area.
 - Please wear shirts at ALL times.

Enforcement:

Mission Trip or Event leaders have the authority to enforce the dress code. You may be asked to change clothes if a leader feels that your attire is inappropriate.
